Ilka Araujo – 2013-2015 - President r wMTA

Brazilian pianist and musicologist Ilka Vasconcelos Araújo holds a B.M. in piano performance from the State University of Ceara in Brazil, a M.M.in piano performance and pedagogy, and a Ph. D. in musicology from the University of Florida. Dr. Araujo has performed and taught master classes in Brazil, the Czech Republic, France, Germany and the United States. She has also presented lectures and lecture-recitals for organizations such as the College Music Society, the International Hawaii Conference in Arts and Humanties and the American Musicological Society.

She has been featured in several regional and national broadcast programs in Brazil such as *Isto É* Magazine, *Siará* Magazine, *Programa do Jô*, Federal University of Ceará Radio, *TV Verdes Mares*, *TV Cultura*, and *TV Jangadeiro* among others. Dr. Araújo advocates the promotion of Brazilian music and culture through lectures and performances. Her articles on Brazilian living composer Marlos Nobre have been topics of many national and international conferences. Her most recent contribution titled *Marlos Nobre* will be published by the Rutledge Encyclopedia of Modernism in 2013. Besides holding a faculty position at Texas Wesleyan University where she teaches music history, music appreciation and private piano, Dr. Araújo also works as an independent piano teacher, scholar and as music director of the FWMTA Middle School Piano Ensemble. News BRIEFS **Theory Testing Program** June Leondar

Music teachers in Fort Worth have the opportunity to enroll their students in an organized music theory study program provided by the Texas Music Teachers Association through the Student Affiliate membership of students.

The twice yearly testing is a cooperative activity among teacher members in the association. Students are grouped by grade levels and tests are presented by teachers in two parts: a written section and an aural section. Test papers are graded by State appointed graders. Medals are awarded to students making 90 or above on the test taken at grade level.

Please Note: Students must be enrolled as Student Affiliates before the **test date of registration**. - **October 14, 2013** for Fall Testing on November 3, 2013.

Ilka Araujo, president of FWMTA writes...

It is often common to think that after five, ten, twenty, thirty plus years in the same profession one knows it all. In a private studio one usually assumes that it would be so much easier if students were motivated, prepared, and practiced their lessons as they should. It is not very often, however, that we, as educators, take the time to reflect upon what we could do to make things a bit different. What could we do to motivate students and how could we inspire them not only on their daily practices, but that those teachings could serve them for the rest of their lives?

Most private teachers do not realize this, but like sports coaches, they are the ones who impact the most a student's life, whether or not that student will follow a music career. Adult students often have strong memories from the teachers they had during their infancy. Those recollections never get erased and even the traumatic experiences are most of the times recalled with grace and humor in adult life.

As the new school year begins, it is an opportunity for us to take a moment to reflect on how we could make a difference. How could we establish real goals in our studios and try to meet them? Despite all temptations and distractions of the twenty-first century, learning an instrument is still noble and rare. It is one activity that generates concentration, discipline, responsibility, dedication, refinement, problem solving, and care. For the best intentions that the studio teacher has it is important to understand that like our students, we are also constantly learning. There is always a different way to teach the same material and knowing different approaches can be extremely effective in circumstances where challenges face us. This would be applicable when teaching a young student who is trying to feel the swing of a syncopated bluesy passage or an advanced one who needs to comprehend the philosophical complexity behind a passage on a late Beethoven sonata.

It is our mission to keep that interest and motivation on our students and therefore, the more we know and the more we expose ourselves to new ideas and innovation the better results we will have from our students. Let us keep our own motivation going and let us keep learning. We are lucky to be in such a rich environment in our metropolitan area and we should take as much advantage as we can. If we do it, it will be easier to convince our students to do it too. Best of luck and have a great year!!!
